Dr. Michael J. Kruger (Ph.D., University of Edinburgh) is President and the Samuel C. Patterson Professor of New Testament and Early Christianity at Reformed Theological Seminary in Charlotte, NC. He is one of the leading scholars today in the study of the origins of the New Testament, particularly the development of the New Testament canon and the transmission of the New Testament text. He is the author of the following books:

- ◇ *The Gospel of the Savior* (Brill, 2005)
- ◇ *The Heresy of Orthodoxy* (Crossway, 2010, with Andreas Köstenberger)
- ◇ *Canon Revisited* (Crossway, 2012)
- ◇ *The Question of Canon* (IVP, 2013)
- ◇ *Christianity at the Crossroads: How the Second Century Shaped the Future of the Church* (SPCK, 2017; IVP Academic, 2018)

Dr. Kruger is also the editor of and contributor to *A Biblical-Theological Introduction to the New Testament* (Crossway, 2016) and co-editor of *The Early Text of the New Testament* (Oxford, 2012) and *Gospel Fragments* (Oxford, 2009). He is ordained in the Presbyterian Church in America and also serves (part-time) as Pastor of Teaching at Uptown PCA in downtown Charlotte. Missions Moment

Steve & Kellie – In Harm's Way Asia

Since 2005, we have been laboring on college campuses and working for shalom in the city. I am the City Director in our place of residence and balance my time teaching, team leading, and looking for creative ways to bless the city and her people. The Majority of Kellie's time each week is spent investing in our four children's education. Her strength is the reason we have been able to labor as long as we have overseas.

As I write this, we are unsure of where God will have us labor next year. The school where I have taught for the last ten years is closing its English Department, eliminating their need for foreign English teachers. We would prefer not to move away from the city we have labored in for the past decade, but from the beginning our city hasn't been an easy place to find teaching positions so it doesn't look very promising that we might stay here. Our organization has offered another leadership position in a different part of the country, as well as made known to us leadership needs in other countries of service. All options are on the table at this point.

Furthermore, the political climate in our country, which has never been favorable toward our worldview, has intensified its pressure to bring all things under its control. Quite often we are hearing stories of foreigners of all nationalities, not just Americans, suddenly being asked to leave. Most of these occurrences are in more sensitive areas, but they are now beginning to happen in our own city. The message the authorities are trying to send is clear: no one is safe.

That, of course, is completely false. We are forever safe in His hands and daily comforted with his ever-with-us presence. The new climate has strengthened our resolve to continue our work with thankfulness for the time we have been given, however long or short that may be.
